- A fabulous display of working and non working models was put up by students of Class XI and XII Commerce reflecting the importance of Commerce in life of a common man.











An Interdisciplinary Activity of Grade 5 students was conducted on World Food Day to create awareness about food and it's importance.



Demonstration of Vermicomposting

Vermicomposting is a way of food waste management in which earthworms usually red wrigglers and white worms, are used to convert organic waste into fertilisers. This enhances plant growth, suppresses diseases in plants, increases porosity and microbial activity in soil, which improves water retention and aeration of soil and therefore earthworms are rightly called "farmer's friends." These aspects of vermicomposting were discussed and reflected in the demonstration of vermicomposting to class V students as a part of Project Preservation. All students enthusiastically participated and asked questions related to the topic.


Fab India


The Bar graphs and Pie charts were prepared in MS Excel which depicted the State Wise Production of fabrics. Students enjoyed learning mathematical concept electronically.






CO-SCHOLASTIC- A SUPPORT TO SCHOLASTICS

It has been argued that extracurricular activities are not very important in a schoolchild's life. I, however, differ with that. A student's social life is as important as their academic life, for their development.

There is so much pressure on students, especially in secondary schools, to perform well in their exams and attain high grades. This, by all means, is not wrong – wanting students to perform exemplarily well in their exams is normal. The problem comes in when students have no life outside their classrooms; when all they do and think about is their books, with no room for their development as human beings.

Many parents, guardians, and students themselves do not understand the importance of extracurricular activities. Teachers in many schools have had to convince some parents and guardians to permit their children to participate in extracurricular activities. This is because the parents feel that those afterschool activities distract them from their studies, or caused them to get home late. This notion couldn't be any more untrue. Co-curricular activities are just as important as academics. They both complement each other to develop a well-rounded student with more social skills than one who only concentrates on their books. Education should go beyond the four classroom walls; it should be more than just books.

Studies have shown that students who participate in co-curricular activities have a marked improvement in the grades. This can be attributed to skills they learn such as better time management to accommodate their hobbies and class activities, better organizational skills and a boost in their self-esteem. Students learn skills such as teamwork, better social skills, and critical thinking. According to studies, students who participate in co-curricular activities were found to have better leadership skills and learnt how to relate better with their peers than those who didn't.

Students who participate in co-curricular activities have a sense of commitment to whatever they are involved in. THIS WILL FOSTER A SENSE OF ACCOUNTABILITY AND RESPONSIBILITY IN THEM.

Most universities nowadays check what the student offers apart from their academics, and that is where co-curricular activities come in. The aim of education should be to develop an all-rounded student in all aspects. This includes the student's intellectual, spiritual, social, physical and moral capabilities. There is need to strike a balance in all these aspects, so as to benefit the child.

ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COSTS OF LITHIUM ION TECHNOLOGY

John B. Goodenough, M. Stanley Whittingham and Akira Yoshino won Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 2019. They developed lithium-ion (known as white gold) batteries which can beused in smart phones, tablets, laptops and electric cars. Due to this reason, the demand forlithium batteries has increased exponentially from 2016 to 2019. According to surveys, the lithium ion industry is expected to grow from 100 GWh of annual production in 2017, to almost 800 GWhs in 2027. These numbers are not expected to decrease as the recently developed lithium-sulphur batteries need excess of lithium at the negative electrode to function properly.

As the demand is increasing at exponential rate, it is important to check the availability of lithium and its harmful effects on environment. Lithium can be extracted from hard rocks, brine lakes and salt pans. Extraction of lithium from hard rocks is cumbersome and hence most of the lithium is extracted from brine lakes by first pumping it out into shallow ponds. It is then dried using solar energy and subsequently treated with soda to precipitate Li 2 CO 3. The process becomes costly and time taking when drying is to be done using external heating. The extraction of lithium using these processes leads to development of toxic waste and the disposal of which has adverse effects on environment. In the year 2016, the toxic chemical leak from Ganzizhou Rongda Lithium mine (Tibetan plateau) has wreaked havoc with the local ecosystem. For processing lithium, lot of water is required (65% of local region water sources) and it has very big impact on local farmers.

In addition to these drawbacks, the extraction process sometimes results in leakage of toxic chemicals from evaporation pools to the adjacent water supply sources. These toxic chemicals include hydrochloric acid, which are used in the processing of lithium into a form that can be sold, as well as those waste products that are filtered out of the brine at each stage. It is important to answer how these environmental and social impacts of new resource are controlled. It is high time to search for solutions in the direction of restricting the demand for lithium batteries in order to balance use of fossil fuels, lithium batteries, solar energy, wind energy, nuclear energy etc., for various applications.

CYCLONES AND THEIR MITIGATION

Cyclones are extremely disastrous hazards that originate in seawater. These are usually followed by rains and wind of very high speed. In fact there are atmospheric disasters that occurs in coastal areas like coastal regions of Bangladesh and India. Cyclones are called by different names in different parts of the world. Cyclones of eastern USA and Caribbean region are called as hurricanes and the same in the North Pacific Oceans are called typhoons. Local storms are called tornados.

Where do cyclones occur?

Cyclones occur in a certain atmospheric area from where they spread in different directions. These usually entend vertically upto 12 to 14 km and horizontally upto 150 to 1000 km. These normally occur during different months of a year like April May or September - November. They mainly affect the coastal areas. I rated along the Bay of Bengal and Arabian sea, Orissa, Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Gujarat, Kerala, Karnataka and Maharashtra are states of India worst affected by tropical cyclones.

How does a cyclone originate?

As sea-water is heated up, it turn in vapour which rises up with the warm air. Thus a depression or the area of low air pressure is created which is called as the centre or the eye of the storm. When this condition of very low atmospheric pressure is combined with forces of strong speedy wind (with a speed ranging from 150 to 400 km per hour). On sea surface, it causes unusual rise of sea waves called as tidal surger the tidal surge cumulatively give birth to a cyclone.

What are the impacts of a cyclone?

Cyclones have various types of serious impact on life, property and environment. They cause severe damages to ships and goods loaded on them. They kill human beings travelling through those ships. A lot of oil is spilled on the surface of sea water which damages ocean - ecosystems. They cause heavy damages to land by depositing salt etc. Besides this, they cause heavy damages to houses, other building, agriculture property and kill humans and cattle on large scale. Cyclones disseminate a number of viral and bacterial diseases like cholera, diarrhoea, hepatitis. They damage coral reefs and mangroves that are habitats of large varieties of animals.

CYCLONES AND THEIR MITIGATION

Some examples of devastating super cyclones are:

- a. Orissa on 29th September, 1971 and caused deaths of 10,000 to 25,000 people.
- b. A super cyclone hit the sea coast of Bangladesh on 10th June, 1991 and caused death of 125,720 persons.
- c. The Eastern India Super Cyclone occurred on 29th Oct., 1994 and caused death of about 9000 persons.
- d. Cyclone Katrina occurred from Aug 23rd-30th, 2005 in New Orleans Louisiana, Southern USA, and caused death of about 1000 people.
- e. Cyclone Phailine occurred in Orissa on 19th Oct. 2013 and 6 people were killed.
- f. Cyclone Hayan occurred in Philippines 10th Nov., 2013 and 10,000 people have died.

SPORTSMANSHIP SPIRIT

Sportsmanship means not only taking part in sports and playing the game in conformity with the rules prescribed, but also playing the game of the life in accordance with the spirit imbibed on the playing fields. A true sportsman observes all those rules in life which he has been taught to observe in games. One who has achieved skill or proficiency in games but has not learned to apply the principles of sports to life in general does not deserve to be true a sportsman. On the contrary, a man who gives evidence of possessing a strong spirit in the wider sphere of life but has not attained excellence in games is still a sportsman. Usually those who play games develop into true sportsman because their character is molded by the training they are gone on the field.

Fair play, respect for discipline, recognition of the need for team work and cheerfulness even in the event of defeat are thus the dominant marks of a sportsman. It is evident that sportsmanship is something worthy of admirations. It is conducive to human happiness and welfare.

Sportsmanship implies first fair play. In games if any player plays foul, the side to which he belongs is penalized. Similarly in bigger game of life one should always be fair in one's dealing with others. Fairness, honesty, integrity, openness of heart and frankness - these are the qualities that a sportsman should display in life. One should not practice deceptions, should not bluff, should not cheat others and should indulge in diplomacy or humbleness. A sportsman never takes undue advantage of the weakness of his adversary nor does he hit below the bet.

Next, sportsmanship implies obedience to the leader. In games the players have to obey their captain and yield to him on points on which they are in disagreement with him. They should repose the fullest confidence in their captains. In life too, a sportsman yields to his superior even if he does not agree with him. Respect for discipline is an essential part of sportsmanship.

Team spirit is also an important element of sportsmanship. In games the various players must cooperate with one another if they wish to win a match. Without mutual cooperation, success is impossible. Similarly in whatever sphere of life one maybe, one must aid and be aided by one's friends if one is a true sportsman. Sportsmanship consists in working in full harmony with others.

WHY IS EDUCATION PARAMOUNT?

Great educational foundation provides the skills for a child to reach his or her greatest potential, but it also cultivates a better future society. The only thing we are certain of is that creativity, imagination and entrepreneurship is going to be absolutely important if we want to not just survive in this new millennium but to TRULY THRIVE. We know that 20 years from now success will hinge not on how much we know, but on our ability to think and act creatively. Creativity is the driving force of economic progress and the decisive source of competitive advantage. True Education has a lot to do with creativity and not just literacy. Gone are the days when education was all about rote learning and this is where the opportunity lies.

Real learning happens when children connect concepts taught in class and apply and extend them outside the classroom. It is only when we link learning to real life we get to see the broader perspective of the subject. Toppers in English who can't speak a grammatically correct sentence in English to toppers in Mathematics who can't apply their knowledge in daily life situations are no different from the dropouts who appear at the other end of the spectrum. Where is the system then regularly and systematically churning out individuals who are 'educated' 'marks -heavy' but highly unskilled and market 'un-ready'?

The cure to this issue is a curriculum that interweaves its assessments so well into its teaching that students do not feel that they are being watched at every moment is the need of the day. This is where schools play an important role, A school that works on a curriculum that is well researched and planned and integrates into its experiences assessments so seamlessly that they form a part of the whole experience without sticking out like a sore thumb.

It is important for everyone involved in the education sector to destroy the old ways of functioning and completely overhaul our education system. One thing to understand is that the world that awaits us 10 years from now is going to be something we can't even imagine at this point, and the need of the hour is to develop ourselves with the right kind of skill sets, this is of paramount importance for a better tomorrow.

Maybe it'll just be one or two or three people, and what, maybe it will be sad to do good and look around you and see how minimal the amount of people doing the same is. But good doesn't come into the world as a fast-fashion or because everyone else is suddenly doing it – quite the opposite, actually.

Good is something that starts from a single effort, a single 'no', a single refusal to go along with what's the norm. Perhaps you won't be as influential as those who go down in history books, maybe you don't have that power or the riches or the support. But who cares? Who cares, because you are a whole person with the power to make a ripple in this giant ocean.

So, if you've read this the whole way through, and if these words have clung to you in the way I meant them to, do this -look up all alternatives you can possibly use instead of plastic, and use them.
